FACILITIES, GENERAL.

a) Structural strength. The facility must be constructed of such material and of such strength as appropriate for the animals involved. The indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals.

***The walls of the singly housed male lion's primary enclosure are covered with sheet metal that is loose in several areas. The portion of sheet metal referenced above, has come unattached from the wall in several areas on the right lower side of the enclosure. One area in particular appears to be sharp and jagged. Also, the plywood partitions set up to separate the tigers are excessively worn and splintered. This is especially obvious near the top of each partition. In addition, the metal bars that make up the enclosure for the two 2 year old tigers are excessively rusty and could possibly compromise the structural integrity of the enclosure. The enclosures must maintained in good repair and in such a manner that promotes structural integrity. Correct by: January 31, 2006
