Some of the lion and tiger enclosures have chewed plastic barrels with sharp holes in them. One tiger enclosure has a tire with several portions missing. The wolf enclosure contains a worn, chewed ball that appears to be disintegrating. While toys are a source of enrichment that can positively impact the lives of the animals, excessively worn or damaged toys can injure the animals via lacerations or ingestion of broken pieces. Excessively worn or damaged toys must be removed to prevent injuries to the animals.
