## HANDLING OF ANIMALS.

(c)(1) During public exhibition, any animal must be handled so there is minimal risk of harm to the animal and to the public, with sufficient distance and/or barriers between the animal and the general viewing public so as to assure the safety of animals and the public.

The rope barrier used for the camel rides does assure the safety of the public. Currently there is a single rope approximately 4 feet from the ground surrounding at the camel ride area. The public, especially children could easily enter the camel ride area under the single layered rope and come in contact with the adult camel "Pete" and become injured. There needs to be a barrier in place between the animal and the general viewing public so there is minimal risk of harm and to assure the safety of the public.
