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The following item is in need of repair, replacement or removal:

A wooden cross beam, at the top of the Diana monkey's outdoor enclosure, is severely rotted. This beam is across the center of the interior of the enclosure and supports the wire mesh as well as other smaller support beams.

Further deterioration of this support beam could impact the structural strength of the enclosure and negatively affect the Diana monkey housed therein. The deteriorated beam must be removed and replaced to prevent animal injury and to improve the structural integrity of the enclosure.

NOTES: A routine maintenance program should be implemented for the entire zoo to ensure that items, such as the items documented on 2-23-12 and 5-23-12, are observed, recognized and addressed BEFORE they become problematic.
