FACILITIES, GENERAL.

(a) Structural strength. The facility must be constructed of such material and of such strength as appropriate for the animals involved. The indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals.

There are six tigers that are being exhibited in an arena that has 12 foot vertical walls. While in the arena on exhibit the tigers are put on pedestals that are 31 inches in height, this reduces the height of the fence to 9 foot 3 inches. The six tigers are also exercised in this arena, but do not have the furniture in the arena. The height of the arena is not sufficient to contain the animals. The wire stringers on the cage are coming undone in quite a few areas leaving gaps.

The facility must be structurally sound, and maintained in good repair to contain the animals.

The arena must be modified to prevent the animals from escape for their well-being, and the well-being of the public. The arena must also be repaired to ensure that the animals are contained.

SPACE REQUIREMENTS.

Enclosures shall be constructed and maintained so as to provide sufficient space to allow each animal to make normal postural and social adjustments with adequate freedom of movement.

The transport enclosures are also used at the primary enclosures for the 6 tigers. The measurement on the enclosures is - 7 feet 3 inches in length, 43 inches in width, and 4 feet in height. The enclosures do not expand in any way to allow proper space for normal postural and social adjustments. At 43 inches in width the enclosures do not allow the tigers to turn around using normal postural movements.
