#### FACILITIES, GENERAL.

(a) Structural strength. The facility must be constructed of such material and of such strength as appropriate for the animals involved. The indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals

- In the pen containing a single sheep and a baby goat, the bottom border of the wire fence is curling upward into the enclosure. This is a potential source of injury to the animals, and could possibly allow the animals to escape into the adjoining area. The fence line must be repaired and maintained in good repair.

- In the enclosure containing a Jacobs sheep mother and baby, there are multiple areas containing sharp points such as nails and wires. Sharp points are a potential source of injury to the enclosed animals, and should be removed and maintained regularly.

- In the enclosure containing two male Jacobs sheep, a metal section of the shelter roof has fallen and is touching the ground. There is an exposed sharp edge, and the shelter itself is not adequate in this condition. Sharp edges must be removed, and the shelter repaired and maintained in good condition.

All repairs must be completed by 14 March 2013.
