CLEANING, SANITIZATION, HOUSEKEEPING, AND PEST CONTROL.

- (a) Cleaning of primary enclosures. Excreta and food waste must be removed from inside each indoor primary enclosure daily and from underneath them as often as necessary to prevent an excessive accumulation of feces and food waste, to prevent the nonhuman primates from becoming soiled, and to reduce disease hazards, insects, pests, and odors. Dirt floors, floors with absorbent bedding, and planted areas in primary enclosures must be spot-cleaned with sufficient frequency to ensure all animals the freedom to avoid contact with excreta, or as often as necessary to reduce disease hazards, insects, pests, and odors.
- Excessive amounts of feces are present on the floor inside of the heated baboon shelter. The majority of the feces are located on the floor below the animals' inside resting perch. Feces can harbor disease causing hazards that affect the animals.

Remove the feces from the enclosure and repeat daily to promote animal health.

Excessive amounts of feces are present beneath the enclosure housing the single ring-tailed lemur. The enclosure is located inside the new, large barn at the facility. Feces can harbor disease causing hazards that affect the animals.

Remove the feces and repeat as necessary to promote animal health.

CLEANING, SANITIZATION, HOUSEKEEPING, AND PEST CONTROL.

(d) Pest control. An effective program for control of insects, external parasites affecting nonhuman primates, and birds and mammals that are pests, must be established and maintained so as to promote the health and wellbeing of the animals and reduce contamination by pests in animal areas.

Inspection Report

Flies are present near and in the enclosures housing the two baboons, the two capuchins, the single ring-tailed lemur, and the five ring-tailed lemurs. The flies were primarily concentrated near the animal wastes and food wastes. Each of these enclosures is located inside of the new, large barn. Flies can carry and spread many disease causing hazards that affect the animals. There were no provisions to control the fly population during the time of inspection.

Implement and maintain an effect program to control the flies in this area to promote animal health.

SANITATION.

(a) Cleaning of enclosures. Excreta shall be removed from primary enclosures as often as necessary to prevent contamination of the animals contained therein and to minimize disease hazards and to reduce odors.

Excessive feces are present in the enclosure housing two grizzly bears. The enclosure, located adjacent to the boars, has excessive amounts of feces concentrated in the smaller lock out area. This area is frequently accessed by the bears as one of their dens is located there.

Feces can harbor many disease causing hazards that affect animals.

Remove the feces and repeat with enough frequency to prevent build up to promote animal health.
