### ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

(b) Each dealer or exhibitor shall establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care that include: (2) The use of appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries, and the availability of emergency, weekend, and holiday care.

\*\*\* An adult, female African Spotted Leopard had an open lesion (approximately 1.5 x 0.75 inches in diameter) near the end of her tail. The lesion was reddened with no hair on it. The hair around the lesion appeared to be wet and the facility representative stated the animal had been licking her tail. According to the facility representative: the lesion had been present for about a week and a half, it was being treated with an antibiotic ointment when they could get to her tail, and had improved since it was first noticed. The veterinarian was not consulted about this lesion and there was no documentation to show how often the medication was being applied. Open lesions could become infected and/or could cause pain and could sometimes indicate a behavioral problem. Accurate documentation must be maintained in order to ensure animals receive appropriate veterinary care. The licensee must consult with the Attending Veterinarian about this animal's lesion and document the prescribed treatment plan. The licensee must ensure all animals receive appropriate veterinary care at all times. TO BE CORRECTED BY: 13 April 2013.
