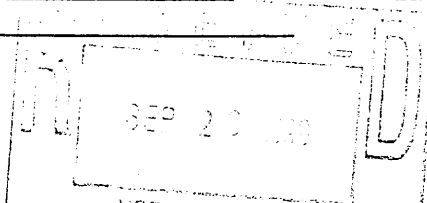
**CATEGORY II: Non-compliant item(s) previously identified for which time remains for correction.**

**Veterinary Care, section 2.40 (b)**

--The inspector was not able to determine whether the problems have been resolved regarding providing adequate assessment of health and well-being so that timely and accurate information on problems of animal health, behavior, and well-being is conveyed to the veterinarian and that appropriate veterinary care is obtained. There have been no known critical events since the last inspection which could be evaluated to see whether an effective program is in place. This will be evaluated further in future inspections. Previous correction date was by 4-3-99.

--The inspector believes there has been some improvement in the condition of the elk. The ribs are still visible on a majority of the adult elk (5 of 9 adult elk). All but

one of the three elk who are reported to be approximately 16 years old now are not thin to the extent that the ribs are visible. These elk are located in the Wild Kingdom pen. In the Pioneer Village pen, at least 4 (ages were: 2 six year olds, 1 four year old, and 1 two year old) of the 7 adult elk are still thin to the extent that their ribs are visible. Two of these have rough hair coats. There was also a relatively new elk in this pen which was reportedly born on approximately 9-5-99. With the exception of the bull elk named "Spike", the thin elk appear to have put on some weight and the haircoats look better. There have reportedly been no changes in the feed regimen. They are reportedly feeding approximately 2 pounds of an oat, barley and corn mixture for each of the elk which reportedly range in weight from approximately 500-600 pounds body weight. A grass hay is being fed. There is no alfalfa visible in it. Lagoon has ordered a new feed (High Energy Deer and Elk Developer) that will be fed free choice out of special feeders. The feed is anticipated to arrive in approximately two weeks, and the feeders in approximately 6 weeks. Lagoon has ordered a Game Management Mineral Block which is expected to arrive tomorrow. The inspector will continue to evaluate the elk to determine whether the facility has an effective program in place to improve the condition of thin elk. Previous correction date was 3-1-99

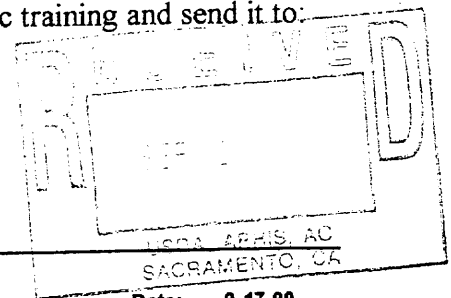
**Employees, section 3.132**

**"D"** --The inspector was not able to determine whether the problems with inadequately trained employees and supervisors has been corrected to the extent that the animal care staff can maintain the professionally acceptable level of husbandry practices as set forth in Subchapter A--Animal Welfare. 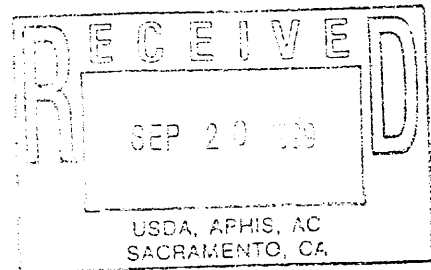
