- 24 feed them anymore. So I took them and fed them
- and then I sold them. 25

- www? 3
- 4 A. What do you mean, like corporation?
- Q. Or who, like, who owns it?
- 6 A. Well, it's a nonprofit. It's a corporation. So
- 7 there is a board and.
- 8 Q. Okay. How many board members are there?
- 9
- 10 Q. Okay. And who are the board members?
- 11 A. I am, and then Adam Shimp and Eunice Petter and
- 12 Aliesha Meyer.
- 13 Q. Okay. And if a decision has to be made for WWW,
- 14 is that done collectively by the whole board or?
- 15 A. It depends on the decision.
- 16 Q. Okay. What types of decisions does the whole
- 17 board make?
- A. Usually the decisions we do on what shows we do. 18
- 19 Q. Okay.
- 20 A. And prices on shows.
- 21 Q. What are some examples of the shows that WWW
- 22 does?
- 23 A. The Dakota County Fair. We also do schools.
- 24 Q. Does WWW own the animals that are involved in
- 25 the show?

A. No. 1 2 Q. No. Okay. And so do they lease them from 3 Fur-Ever Wild? 4 A. They lease them from me. 5 Q. Okay. Lease from you. Okay. So the animals

- 6 are then -- are they technically then owned by
- 7 you personally?
- 8 A. Yes.
- 9 Q. Okay. And with regards to WWW, what types of
- 10 animals does that entity display?
- 11 A. North American fur bearing wildlife.
- 12 Q. Okay. Can you give me some examples of the
- 13 animals that you bring on the shows?
- 14 A. Depends on the show.
- 15 Q. Okay.
- 16 A. Depends on the time of year. Sometimes we just
- 17 bring, you know, one or two. It could be just a
- 18 raccoon. There are some places where we bring
- 19 some of the agricultural animals, like the goats
- 20 or the pigs or sometimes we bring in a full setup
- 21 like the wolves, the Cougars, the raccoons, the
- 22 skunks, the fox.
- 23 Q. Okay. Is that a decision that you make with the
- 24 host of the event of --
- 25 A. Yes.

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- Q. Okay.
- A. And it depends on who we're educating that day.
- Q. Okay. How long has WWW been in existence?
- A. '96.
- 5 Q. Okay.
- A. I'm sorry. 2006.
- 7 Q. Okay. No problem. Was it known by any other
- 8 name before that or was it a brand new --
- 9 A. It was a new organization.
- 10 Q. -- organization? It was new. Okay. So in 2006
- 11 when WWW was formed, did you personally already
- 12 own the animals that would be used by WWW?
- 13 A. Yes.
- 14 Q. Okay. Is WWW still active today?
- 15 A. Yes.
- 16 Q. Okay.
- 17 A. Well, I wouldn't say today we're active. When
- 18 we go out and do shows.
- 19 Q. Okay. Sure. But it's an entity that still
- 20 exists?
- 21 A. Yes.
- 22 Q. Does WWW have any employees?
- 23 A. No.
- 24 Q. How about volunteers?
- 25 A. They have volunteers.

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- 11 A. They usually go to shows.
- 12 Q. Okay.

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- 13 A. Help set them up and then help talk to people
- 14 and help tear down.
- 15 Q. Do they provide services to any other entity
- 16
- 17 exclusively volunteer with WWW?
- 18 A. It depends on where we're at.
- 19 Q. Okay.

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- 20 A. It depends on if we're at a show. You know, I
- 21 have some friends that come out and help me. It
 - all depends on -- so the volunteers can go back
- 23 and forth either just to help me or to volunteer
- 24 for that.
- 25 Q. Okay. Now you said that WWW was new in 2006.

1 Was that on your current property? Did they

- 2 operate on your current property?
- 3 A. It's a traveling show.
- 4 Q. Okay.
- 5 A. So, that's kind of a...
- 6 Q. Okay. And I can rephrase the question if
- 7 that -- if it doesn't make sense. So let me back
- 8 up. Does WWW hold any events on your property?
- 9 A. Once in a while. Not a lot.
- 10 Q. When WWW does hold events on your property, like
- 11 what types of events are those?
- 12 A. I wouldn't really call them events. If a Girl
- 14 some handicapped schools come in, that's what we
- 15

13

- 16 Q. Okay. So what happens when they would come to
- 17 your property?
- 18 A. We give them agri-tours.
- 19 Q. And what's involved in that?
- 20 A. We go around and we show them about farm life.
- 21 Depends on what -- depends on what they are
- 22 capable of doing. Some of the handicapped, you
- know, homes and facilities that we really can't 23
- 24 have them, you know, get in there and learn about 25
 - brushing a horse; or learn about, you know, what

- 1 it is to clean, you know, goat areas. Or, you
- 2 know, even how to -- you know, some Boy Scouts
- 3 and Girl Scouts, we come in and teach them about,
- 4 you know, trapping or fur or skinning or, you
- 5 know, that kind of stuff. So it depends on the
- 2
- 6 group.
- 7 Q. Okay.
- 8 A. We have a lot of physically handicapped people
- 9 come in. It's not like everybody can do
- 10 everything.
- 11 Q. Okay. So I guess first if you had a group that
- didn't have any physical disabilities, where do
- 13 they -- where do they go on the property? Do you
- 14 have like an area set up for them, or is it --
- 15 can they go anywhere on the property?
- 16 A. They can't go anywhere because we're federally
- 17 regulated.
- 18 Q. Okav.
- 19 A. So they can only go to spots where we have what
- 20 we call human barriers.
- 21 Q. And what does that mean?
- 22 A. It's a -- depends on the animals. Anywhere from
- 23 a three to six-foot barrier on the other side of
- 24 the cage, so the people can't get right up to the
- 25 animals.

- **1 Q.** Okay.
- 2 A. And that's federal regulation.
- 3 Q. Is that for certain animals?
- 4 A. It's for everything except for chickens and
- 5 horses.
- 6 Q. Okay.
- 7 A. It is for pigs, goats, everything.
- 8 Q. Okay. What animals are on the property?
- 9 A. All of them. We have --
- 10 Q. As many as you are able to think of right here.
- 11 A. We have horses, goats, pigs, feeder hogs and
- 12 then we have sheep, and then we go into wolves,
- 13 Cougars, fox, raccoons, skunks, Bobcats, Links,
- 14 prairie dogs, porcupines, woodchucks. Those I
- 15 think are what we have now.
- 16 Q. Okay. So for the animals, are they then set up
- in their own, like a fenced area for each of the
- 18 species?
- 19 A. Yes.
- 20 Q. Okay. Are all of those animals able to be
- 21 viewed --
- 22 A. No.
- 23 Q. -- if a group comes? Okay. Which ones are not
- 24 accessible to be viewed or nobody is able to view
- 25 them?
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- A. There is only about a quarter of them that are
- 2 able to be viewed.
- 3 Q. Okay.
- 4 A. They are not all -- because you have your
- 5 breeders, you have your babies, you have your
- 6 feeder hogs, you know, those aren't able to be
- 7 viewed.
- 8 Q. Okay. Is it a few of each animal that are
- 9 viewable?
- 10 A. Usually, yes.
- **11 Q.** Okay. Just not all of each type of animal?
- 12 A. Right.
- 13 Q. Okay. So, for example, say like a Girl Scout
- 14 Troop, if they come on, would they be able to see
- 15 the wolves?
- 16 A. They can see some.
- 17 Q. Okay. Or the wolves that you've chosen to show?
- 18 A. They can see probably a quarter of them.
- 19 Q. Okay. Do you have like a separate area for the
- 20 wolves that are not --
- 21 A. Yes.
- 22 Q. -- viewable? Okay. Are there some indoor areas
- 23 for the animals as well?
- 24 A. For people to see? No.
- 25 Q. Just generally?

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- 17
- 1 A. Yes. They are in my barn.
- 2 Q. Okay. And those --
- 3 A. Or my barns.
- 4 Q. Okay. And do the -- and I think maybe you were
- 5 getting at this, but I just want to ask the
- **6** question so we have a clear record. So like a
 - Girl Scout Troop, are they able to go into one of
- 8 the barns to see the animals?
- 9 A. No.

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- **10 Q.** Okay. So they have to be outside to see them?
- 11 A. Yes.
- 12 Q. Okay. Before I go too far ahead, also I want to
- 13 ask you about Fur-Ever Wild. What is the type of
- 14 structure for Fur-Ever Wild, or what kind of
- 15 entity is that?
- 16 A. There is two Fur-Ever Wilds.
- 17 Q. Okay. So I guess what's the first one?
- 18 A. One is Fur-Ever Wild, Limited.
- 19 Q. Okay. What's the other one?
- A. Fur-Ever Wild, just a proprietorship.
- 21 Q. Like a sole proprietorship?
- 22 A. Yes.
- **Q.** Okay. Is that registered with the State?
- 24 A. The sole proprietorship?
- 25 Q. Yes.

- Q. And is the limited company also registered?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. And first, what is the ownership
- 5 structure of the limited company?
- A. You mean --
- 7 Q. Fur-Ever Wild Limited?
- A. You mean if it's a corporation? 8
- 9 Q. Of the owner -- of who is the owner, or who are
- 10 the owners?
- A. There is a board. 11
- 12 Q. Okay. Who is on the board?
- 13 A. There is three.
- 14 Q. All right.
- 15 A. Adam Shimp, Dan Storlie and Jay Petter.
- 16 Q. And then you said that there is the sole
- 17 proprietorship. Who is the owner of that?
- 18 A. I am.
- Q. Okay. When was the sole proprietorship formed? 19
- 20 A. Three months ago. Two months ago.
- 21 Q. Okay. And when was Fur-Ever Wild Limited
- 22 formed, if you know?
- 23 A. 2000 and -- I'm trying to think -- '11.
- 24 Q. Okay. Prior to Fur-Ever Wild Limited being
- 25 formed, was that known by any other name?

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- 1 A. No.
- 2 Q. Okay.
- 3 A. Well, basically Fur-Ever Wild limit is just my
- 4 ranch name.
- Q. Okay. 5
- 6 A. And we used to call it Spirit Ranch Two.
- 7 Q. And when you called it Spirit Ranch, was that
- 8 just what you called it or was that a registered
- 9 name with the State?
- 10 A. It wasn't registered.
- Q. Okay. What does Fur-Ever Wild Limited do? 11
- 12 A. It is basically the ranch. So, it's a hog farm.
- 13 And we also do corn and we also fur.
- 14 Q. With the corn, is that something that you
- 15 harvest directly or do you lease out for corn
- 16 harvest?
- 17 A. I lease out for corn. Well, I lease out for
- 18 trade for hay, because that used to be my
- 19 hayfield. So then they pay me, plus I get hay.
- 20 Q. Okay. How long have you operated the hog farm?
- 21 A. A year.
- 22 Q. Okay. And then how long have you operated the
- 23 fur farm?
- 24 A. Seven years.
- Q. Okay. And that's both the hog farm and the fur

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farm are on your property?

- A. Yes. 2
- 3 Q. Okay.
- 4 A. Well, there is, depending on -- there is two
- 5 properties.
- 6 Q. Okay. And on your address for 10132 - 235th
- 7 Street?
- 8 A. There is hogs and fur.
- Q. Okay. On that property?
- A. Yes. And on the other one there is hogs and fur
- 11 on there also.
- 12 Q. And what's the other one?
- A. The 24005. 13
- 14 Q. Okay. And when you say they are right next to
- 15 each other, I guess I just want to back up and
- 16 make sure we have a clear record.
- 17 A. They adjoin each other.
- 18 Q. Okay. Have they always been separate parcels?
- 19
- 20 Q. Okay.
- 21 A. I bought them separately.
- 22 Q. Which parcel do you reside on?
- 23 A. The 235th.
- Q. Is there any residence on the Dodd property?
- 25 A. Yes.

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- Q. Okay. Do you rent that out?
- A. Yes. 2
- Q. Okay. And so, it sounds like you have animals
 - then on both parcels; is that correct?
- 5 A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. Earlier when I was asking about people 6
- 7 coming to look at some of the animals, would that
- 8 mean that they also may set foot on the Dodd
- 9 parcel?
- 10 A. No.
- 11 Q. Okay. So if they are going to look at any of
- 12 the animals, that would exclusively be on the
 - 235th Street parcel?
- 14 A. Yes.

- 15 Q. Okay. And so is the Dodd parcel just used
- 16 for -- just for raising animals for operation?
- 17 A. We sell hog food out of there also.
- 18 Q. Okay. Would selling the hog food out of the
- Dodd Avenue parcel, is that -- or is it Dodd 19
- 20 Road?
- 21 A. Dodd Boulevard.
- 22 Q. Dodd Boulevard.
- 23 A. That's where we warehouse it.
- Q. Is that like a structure that somebody goes to 24 25 buy the hog food?
 - KINSELLA, HARTIGAN & KELZER, INC

Dakota County, MN

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- 1 A. We just warehouse it there?
- 2 Q. Okay. So if somebody wanted to buy the hog
- 3 food, where would they actually have to
- 4 physically go to purchase it?
- 5 A. We deliver it.
- 6 Q. Okay. So they would have to call you for a
- 7 delivery?
- 8 A. Yes.
- 9 Q. Okay. Just so that we understand each other, as
- 10 I go forward and ask questions about the
- 11 property, I'm just going to be referring to the
- 12 property that you reside on and that where people
- 13 may come to visit. So the 235th Street, unless I
- 14 specifically ask you about Dodd Boulevard. But
- 15 if you are confused, let me know and then I'll
- make sure it's clear of which property I'm asking
- 17 about.
- 18 A. Okay.
- 19 Q. And then actually just so I understand, what
- 20 direction is the Dodd Boulevard property from the
- 21 parcel on 235th Street?
- 22 A. Southeast.
- 23 Q. Okay. Now, you mentioned Fur-Ever Wild,
- 24 Limited. Does the hog farm have corn and also
- 25 does the fur farm. In the day-to-day operations,
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 - 23

- 1 who makes the decisions?
- 2 A. I do.
- 3 Q. Okay. Does anybody else on the board have
- 4 authority for the day-to-day decisions for
- 5 Fur-Ever Wild, Limited?
- 6 A. Well, we all converse on it.
- 7 Q. Okay.
- 8 A. We all making decisions on like what animals are
- 9 going that year, what we're breeding, what we're
- 10 not.
- 11 Q. Okay. And does Fur-Ever Wild, Limited, the
- 12 organization, own any animals?
- 13 A. No. Well, they own pigs.
- 14 Q. Okay. And does Fur-Ever Wild, the sole
- proprietorship, own any of the animals?
- 16 A. Well, all of them, except for the pigs.
- 17 $\,$ Q. Okay. And just so that I'm clear, earlier when
- 18 you had made a list of animals that are on the
- 19 property, are those actually owned by Fur-Ever
- 20 Wild, the sole proprietorship?
- 21 A. Yes.
- 22 Q. Okay. So not you as an individual, but by
- 23 Fur-Ever Wild, the sole proprietorship?
- 24 A. That is me.
- 25 Q. And I mean is it the structure that owns them or KINSELLA, HARTIGAN & KELZER, INC.

- do you just personally own them?
- 2 A. I personally own them.
- 3 Q. Okay. Which animals are raised for fur?
- 4 A. They all are.
- 5 Q. So the animals that you would --
- 6 A. Except for the pigs.
- 7 Q. Okay. Sure.
- 8 A. And the goats. Those are raised for meat.
- 9 Q. Okay.
- 10 A. And the horses are raised for meat, but we --
- 11 this is going to sound horrible. We also sell
- 12 the horses to taxidermists.
- 13 Q. Okay. Now, when -- you know, I really don't
- 14 know anything about fur farming. So is there
- 15 kind of a schedule that you have for each animal
- 16 as to when they will be put down and skinned or
- 17 is it something --
- 18 A. Sorry. I thought I turned that off.
- 19 Q. Okay. Or is it something that you wait until
- 20 the animal dies naturally?
- 21 A. It depends.
- 22 Q. Okay. What does it depend on?
- 23 A. It depends on the fur market.
- 24 Q. Okay.
- 25 A. It depended last year if I had a barn to skin in

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- 1 or not. So, last year we sold whole carcasses,
 - 2 if you want to call it that, because we had no
 - 3 place to skin. So, last year we didn't get to
 - 4 pelt anything. So then this year there is a lot
 - 5 of wolves. And then we never got to breed last
 - 6 year, so there is no foxes to pelt, or raccoons
 - your, so there is no reads to part, or ruses.
 - 7 or skunks.
 - 8 Q. Have you pelted anything in the last few months?
 - 9 A. I pelted two wolves last night.
 - 10 Q. Okay.
 - 11 A. And there is another two going tonight. And as
 - 12 soon as my vet, which he heard when I was
 - 13 talking, I get my romp, then the rest of them go.
 - 14 There will be 25 within the next three weeks --
 - 15 two weeks.
 - 16 Q. And who do you sell the pelts to?
 - 17 A. It depends on the fur market.
 - 18 Q. Okay.
 - 19 A. Some of them go to Toronto, some of them go to a
 - 20 guy in Indianapolis, some of them go to another
 - 21 fur dealer named Hannibal. There is another guy
 - named Danny down in Waseca. Some of them we sell
 - 23 straight to taxidermists?
 - 24 Q. Now, you mentioned wolves. Is there any other
 - animal that you've pelted in the last few months?
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- 1 A. We pelted a fisher. And -- because right now
- 2 we're pelting. It just started, pelting season.
- 3 So what we have in the past few months, or what
- 4 we will in the next few months, that's a big
- difference because it's just getting cold. 5
- 6 Q. So when is pelting season?
- 7 A. It starts right about now.
- 8 Q. Okay. How long does it last?
- 9 A. Three weeks.
- 10 Q. Okay. Is there a reason that it -- is it the
- 11 same time every year?
- 12 A. No.
- 13 Q. Okay. How do you determine when pelting season
- 14
- A. Depends on the weather. 15
- 16 Q. Okay.
- 17 A. It depends on what the -- if it's cold out. It
- 18 depends on how fast they blow their prime coats.
- It depends on the animals. Some of them that are 19
- 20 younger don't get primed fur right away. Some of
- 21 them, you know, that are older get their winter
- 22 coat earlier.
- 23 Q. Okay. So does the weather affect the value of
- 24 their fur?
- 25 A. Uh-huh.

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- Q. Okay. 1
- 2 A. Well, I wouldn't say it affects the value. It
- 3 depends on when they get their coats.
- Q. Okay. And I guess I should say quality of their 4
- 5 fur. Did you know what I meant by value? The
- 6 quality of their fur?
- 7 A. I wouldn't say it does the quality. It just
- 8 depends on when it comes in, the timing.
- 9 Q. So is it possible that an animal can end up with
- 10 a nice quality fur in the summer?
- A. No. 11
- 12 Q. No. Okay.
- 13 A. It has to be in the winter. That's when their
- 14 winter coat comes in.
- 15 Q. Okay.
- 16 A. It's called "in prime".
- 17 Q. "In prime"?
- 18 A. Prime.
- 19 Q. Okay. And what buildings do you use for the
- 20 peltina?
- 21 A. Well, this year we'll use our barn.
- 22 Q. Okay.
- 23 A. That I wasn't allowed to be in last year at this
- 24 time.
- 25 Q. And so that's the new barn?

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1 A. Yes.

- 2 Q. Okay. Now, you've mentioned -- we have talked
- 3 about WWW, Fur-Ever Wild Limited and Fur-Ever
- 4 Wild the sole proprietorship. Is there any other
- 5 entity or business that you are involved in?
- 6 A. Yes.
- 7 Q. Okay. And what's the -- what is that?
- A. Well, the d/b/a, Spirit Ranch Livestock. And
- 9 that's what we sell the hog food under.
- 10 Q. Okay.
- 11 A. But that's just a d/b/a. And then there is
- 12 Spirit Ranch One and Two. Those are what my
- 13 conditional use permits are under.
- 14 Q. Okay.
- 15 A. And that's boarding and breeding and sales of
- 16 horses, cattle and dogs. And that's for both
- 17 properties. That's why Spirit Ranch One and Two.
- Q. Does Spirit Ranch One go with one of the parcels 18
 - and Spirit Ranch Two with the other?
- A. Yes. 20

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- 21 Q. Okay. Which parcel goes with Spirit Ranch One?
- 22 A. That's the 24005.
- 23 Q. Okay. Dodd?
- 24 A. Yes.
- 25 Q. Okay. And then the Spirit Ranch Two goes with

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- the 235th Street? 1
- 2 A. Yes.
- 3 Q. Okay. And are those, the Spirit Ranch One and
- 4 Two, are those operations still going on today?
- 5 A. Yes.
- 6 Q. Okay. And then when you said Spirit Ranch
- 7 Livestock as a d/b/a, does that then fall under
- 8 the registered -- the registered name of Fur-Ever
- 9 Wild?
- 10 A. That's just under me.
- 11 Q. Okay. And then d/b/a, does business as Spirit
- 12 Ranch Livestock?
- 13 A. Yes.
- 14 Q. Okay. Any other entities or business you are
- 15 involved in?
- 16 A. No. Oh, yes. I'm a K-Bid affiliate.
- 17 Q. Can you spell K-Bid?
- 18 A. Just K-Bid. K - B-i-d.
- 19 Q. K-Bid?
- 20 A. Yes.
- 21 Q. What is K-Bid?
- 22 A. It's an on-line auction service.
- 23 Q. Okay. You said K-Bid affiliate. What does that
- 24
- A. It means that I go to places and sell their

- stuff for them on line.
- **Q.** Okay. Is that kind of like E-Bay?
- 3 A. Kind of.
- 4 Q. Okay.
- 5 A. But it's an auction.
- 6 Q. Okay. And that's all on line?
- 7 A. Yes.
- 8 Q. Okay. So just with regards to the two
- 9 properties, is there any other business that is
- 10 conducted on the properties?
- 11 A. No.
- 12 Q. Okay. And you mentioned that you reside on the
- 13 235th parcel. Have you resided on it for all 14
- 14 years?
- 15 A. Yes.
- **16 Q**. Okay.
- 17 A. Yes. Well, probably 13. It took me a year to
- 18 build the house.
- 19 Q. Okay. So you built the new house on the
- 20 property?
- 21 A. Yes.
- 22 Q. Okay. And would that be -- do you know what
- year that would be that you actually moved onto
- 24 the property?
- 25 A. No.

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- 1 Q. Okay. When did you move any of the animals onto
- 2 the property?
- 3 A. Actually the barn was there before I was.
- 4 Q. Okay.
- 5 A. I built the barn first.
- 6 Q. Okay. So you built the barn before you built
- 7 your house?
- 8 A. Yes.
- **9 Q.** Okay. And what animals did you then move onto
- 10 the -- into that barn?
- 11 A. That at that time was Black Angus and horses at
- 12 that time.
- 13 Q. Okay. What did you -- when you first built the
- barn and purchased the property, what did you do
- on the property?
- 16 A. Raised horses and cattle.
- 17 Q. Okay.
- 18 A. Sorry. It's Black and Red Angus.
- 19 Q. Okay. How long did you do that before you -- I
- guess when was the next animal or what was thenext animal that you brought onto the property?
- 22 A. Well, there is -- I had to wait until I moved
- 23 there.
- **24 Q**. Okay.
- 25 A. So as soon as I moved there, then all the other

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- 1 animals followed.
- 2 Q. Okay. And when you say "all the other animals".
- 3 can you generally tell me what animals? Was it
- 4 all of the ones you listed earlier?
- 5 A. Probably not all of them. There were wolves,
- 6 raccoons, fox. I'm trying to think way back
- 7 then. Bobcats, porcupines and goats.
- **Q.** Where did you move the animals from?
- 9 A. The 24005.
- 10 Q. Okay. So they were on Dodd and then you moved
- 11 them to 235th Street?
- 12 A. Yes.
- 13 Q. Okay. Do you recall when you had -- when you
- 14 first had those animals on the Dodd property?
- 15 A. The first wolf I got was in 1992.
- 16 Q. Okay. And on the Dodd property, did you always
- 17 reside on that when you owned it until you moved
- 18 to 235th?
- 19 A. Right.
- 20 Q. Okay. What structures are on the 235th Street
- 21 parcel?

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- 22 A. There is a house, what we call a cat shed, a fox
 - shed and the main barn.
- 24 Q. Okay. And is the main barn your -- the new
- 25 building?

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- 1 A. Yes.
- **Q.** Okay. And then what structures are on the Dodd
- 3 property?
- 4 A. There is a house, a garage, a Quonset, a dog
- 5 kennel.
- 6 Q. I'm sorry. What did you say before dog kennel?
- 7 A. A Quonset.
- 8 Q. What is a Quonset?
- 9 A. It's like a metal dome storage building.
- 10 Q. Okay. And were you finished or did I cut you
- **11** off?
- 12 A. No. And then there is an indoor riding arena
- 13 and eight box stalls.
- 14 Q. Eight box stalls you said?
- 15 A. Yes.
- **16 Q.** And what are the box stalls for?
- 17 A. Pigs.
- **18 Q.** Okay.
- 19 A. Supposed to be for horses but I have pigs in
- 20 them right now.
- 21 Q. Okay. So on the 235th Street property, do you
 - board any horses on that property?
- 23 A. I have two.
- 24 Q. Two. Okay. Are those your personal horses or
- are you boarding them for somebody?
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- 1 A. Those are boarding.
- 2 Q. Okay.
- 3 A. That's what you asked; isn't it?
- 4 Q. Yes. And where -- which structure would they be
- 5 kept in?
- 6 A. They are not kept in a structure.
- 7 Q. Okay.
- 8 A. Those are border horses, not mine.
- 9 Q. Okay. And then do you board any of the horses
- 10 on the Dodd property?
- 11 A. There is usually two.
- 12 Q. Two on that property as well?
- 13 A. Uh-huh.
- 14 Q. Okay.
- 15 A. And I have CUP's for that.
- 16 Q. How many horses do you personally have?
- 17 A. Twelve.
- 18 Q. Okay. And are they all outside or do you keep
- 19 them in any structure?
- 20 A. They are outside.
- 21 Q. Okay. And with regards to the structures on
- 22 235th Street, were those -- now you already said
- you built the house there. And we know that you
- 24 built the barn there. The cat shed and the fox
- 25 shed, were those also buildings that you built on

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- 1 the property?
- 2 A. Yes.
- 3 Q. Okay. And then similarly for the Dodd property,
- 4 were all the structures built on the property?
- 5 A. Yes.
- 6 Q. Okay.
- 7 A. Well, they were already built. I didn't build
- 8 them.
- 9 Q. They were just already there when you --
- 10 A. On Dodd.
- 11 Q. -- purchased it?
- 12 A. Right.
- 13 Q. Okay. And then actually for the 235th Street,
- 14 the cat shed and the fox shed, were those already
- 15 on the property?
- 16 A. No. I built them.
- 17 Q. You built those. Okay. And did you -- do you
- 18 have like a chapel on the -- or used to be a
- 19 chapel that's also on the property?
- 20 A. It used to be a chapel.
- 21 Q. Okay. Is that a structure that's on the
- 22 property?
- 23 A. Yes.
- 24 Q. Okay.
- 25 A. It's a portable one.

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- Dakota County, MN

 1 Q. A portable? Okay. How is it moved?
- A portable: Okay, How is it in
- 2 A. Truck, trailer.
- 3 Q. Okav.
- 4 A. That was how we got it there.
- Q. So it used to be a chapel. What do you use it
- 6 for now?
- 7 A. To sell fur out of.
- 8 Q. Okay. And how long has that been on the
- 9 property?
- 10 A. Almost two years. It was moved on the property
- 11 almost two years ago. Where it's sitting now,
- 12 it's only been there almost a year or a little
- 13 over a year.
- 14 Q. Okay. Is there --
- 15 A. It was moved and then it was moved again because
- 16 it was just set in a temporary position for a
- 17 month.
- 18 Q. How do you determine where it will be moved? Is
- 19 it just a matter of personal preference?
- 20 A. I guess.
- 21 Q. Okay. And you mentioned selling fur out of
- 22 that. Is that something let's say somebody can
- drive up anytime to go purchase fur, or is there
- 24 set hours, or how could somebody go and arrange
- 25 for that?

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- 1 A. It depends. Since there is nobody allowed in
- 2 the barn and since I've got to sell my fur
- 3 sometime, it depends on if we're there on
- 4 weekends, my gate is usually closed, then, you
- 5 know, we're working around there. But like
- 6 yesterday I had a fur buyer come in and that's
- 7 the only place to keep them warm.
- Q. Okay.
- 9 A. And so we go in there and we talk about
- 10 transactions and do paperwork and all that kind
- 11 of stuff.

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- 12 Q. Do they have to set up an appointment with you
 - ahead of time?
- 14 A. A lot of times.
- **15 Q.** Okay. And so sometimes can somebody just come
- 16 to buy it?
- 17 A. If my gates are open, yes.
- 18 Q. Okay. Can anybody buy the fur or do you have to
 - have a certain qualification to buy the fur from
- 20 you?
- 21 A. If depends on if it's raw.
- 22 Q. Okay. And just, you know, I don't understand
- 23 all of the terminology. So is that nothing has
- 24 been treated with the fur or --
- 25 A. Right.

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- 1 Q. So you literally might see blood on it; is that
- 2 what you mean?
- 3 A. Right.
- 4 Q. Okay. And is there a terminology for it not
- 5 being raw?
- 6 A. Tanned.
- 7 Q. Tanned. So does that mean anybody could touch
- 8 it and grab it?
- 9 A. Right.
- 10 Q. Okay. So, can anybody purchase the tanned fur?
- 11 A. Right.
- 12 Q. Okay. And if it's raw, who has -- what do you
- 13 have to have to be able to purchase the raw fur?
- 14 A. It all depends on what your qualifications are.
- 15 Sometimes you just need my DNR number. Sometimes
- 16 you have to have your raw fur buyer license. It
- 17 all depends on what your status is. And it
- 18 depends on, you know, usually you would take my
- 19 DNR paperwork with you, especially in order to
- 20 get Cities tags. C-i-t-i-e-s. That's from the
- 21 U.S. Fish and Wildlife.
- 22 Q. Okay. What does that tag mean?
- 23 A. Then you can bring it across borders, bring it
- 24 into Canada.
- 25 Q. Okay.

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- A. Or you can ship it federal, like to Model
- 2 Tannery, called Model Mink. And so you need your
- 3 Cities permits in order to ship it, because
- 4 that's federal.
- 5 Q. Okay. Earlier you said that you got your first
- 6 wolf in 1992?
- 7 A. Uh-huh.
- 8 Q. And do you know how many wolves you have today?
- 9 A. I think I have 52.
- 10 Q. Okay.
- 11 A. Sorry. 49.
- 12 Q. Oh, sure.
- 13 A. Oops.
- 14 Q. No problem. So, that is about 20 years, if I'm
- doing my math right. Do you have kind of an idea
 - of how much the wolves would increase each year,
- in I guess very generally?
- 18 A. Can you rephrase that?
- 19 Q. Sure.

- 20 A. You mean how much the pelts are worth, how many
- 21 animals I have?
- 22 Q. And I guess maybe a better way would be is: You
- went from 1 to 49. Did you go that way from
- 24 breeding them or did you purchase the wolves?
 - A. Some of them -- it depends on the blood lines.

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- 1 Q. Okay.
- 2 A. Rule number one, wild wolves are from 70 to 90
- 3 pounds. My wolves, the females are 90 pounds.
- 4 The males are 130. You work for years to get
- 5 those blood lines. That is the difference
- 6 between making them -- keep them two years or
- 7 being able to pelt them for one year. The
- 8 yearlings -- our yearlings are bigger than the
- 9 ones in the wild. So, you breed for size.
- 10 Q. Okay.
- 11 A. You breed for blood lines. You breed for fur
- 12 quality. It takes years to get to that.
- 13 Q. Are they more valuable when they are bigger?
- 14 A. Bigger.
- **15 Q.** Okay. I suppose you get more fur that way?
- 16 A. It's not necessarily -- they go by foot.
- 17 Q. Okay.
- 18 A. So some people measure them from nose to tip of
- 19 tail. Some people measure them from nose to
- 20 beginning of the tail. If you measure from the
- 21 nose to the beginning of the tail, the six
- 22 footers and above are the most valuable. You
- 23 almost get double in price.
- 24 Q. Okay. And maybe if we kind of break it down.
- 25 Say from 1992 you had one wolf. Do you have an

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1 idea of approximately how many wolves you may

- 2 have had in 2002? So ten years later?
- 3 A. I can't remember that far.
- 4 Q. Okay. That's fine. Maybe if we say -- so 2012,
- 5 today, you've got about 49 wolves. Say five
- 6 years ago, do you have an idea of how many wolves
- 7 you might have had approximately?
- 8 A. Probably 15.
- Q. Okay.
- 10 A. Approximately.
- 11 Q. Sure.

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- 12 A. And it depends on time of year. It depends on
- 13 breeding season. It depends on -- you know,
- 14 everything changes rapidly.
- 15 Q. Okay. So, could the number suddenly spike
 - because you now have the new wolves?
- 17 A. It could spike because of the baby season.
- 18 Q. And then it could drop again if you pelted
- 19 several of the wolves?
- 20 A. Or if I sell them live or, you know, like
- 21 between December 15th and January 15th I could
 - drop in haif.
- **23 Q.** Okay.
- 24 A. In May I could quadruple.
- 25 Q. Sure.

42 1 A. It depends. Last year, since the wolves were 2 outside and you don't have to artificially 3 inseminate them like you do the fox and that kind 4 of stuff, the last year we could still live 5 breed. I had four litters. I had a nine, an 6 eight, an eight and an eight, which was amazing. 7 They usually have anywhere between two and four. 8 Last year we had huge litters because we probably 9 figured out the proper nutrition and everything 10 else and, you know, it all depends. 11 Q. Okay. Maybe something that will help us kind of 12 talk about some other animals, I have an Exhibit 13 here that we'll get marked. 14 (Whereupon, PETTER Exhibit 15 Number 1 was marked for 16 identification by the court 17 reporter.) 18 BY MS. ANGOLKAR: 19 Q. I'm showing you what has been marked as Exhibit 20 1. First I'm just wondering if you recognize 21 this document? 22 A. Uh-huh. 23 Q. And how do you recognize it? 24 A. Okay. And we see at the top there it says: 4 "Received Eureka Township May 12th", and looks 5 like somebody wrote "2008". Does that help you 6 recall when you would have made the document? 7 A. I don't know for certain. Q. Okay. And so does this kind of help us with a frame of reference? We talked about wolves already. Do you recall when you first obtained KINSELLA, HARTIGAN & KELZER, INC.

So the first 2 time you obtained fox? 3 A. No, not the year. 4 Q. Okay. 5 A. Probably 2005, 2004, 2003. Q. Maybe a way to help, too, would be to even think 7 of which property you were on at the time. So is 8 the first time that you got the fox was when you 9 were on the 235th Street parcel? A. I think I was living there, but I had them down 10 11 on Dodd in the barn. 12 Q. Okay. And then how about -- I'm just going to 13 kind of run through the list so you can kind of 14 see where I'm going. When is the first time that you obtained raccoon? 15 A. '04. 0 something. I don't know the years on 16 17 all these. Q. Okay. 18 19 A. That would be impossible for me to know. 20 Q. That's fine. If we hit one and you don't really 21 know, just let me know. I'm still going to run 22 through the list just so see if maybe you do 23 remember for some of them. So how about Links? 24 Do you remember when you got your first Links? 25 A. I've had all these for years, except for KINSELLA, HARTIGAN & KELZER, INC. 45 wolverine we don't have anymore. 1 2 Q. Okay. And so with regard to Links, do you 3 remember the first time you got a Links? 4 A. No. Q. Okay. How about Bobcat, do you remember the 6 first time you got a Bobcat? 7 A. No. 8 Q. Okay. 9 A. - 2 A. And the Minnesota Department of Ag.
- 3 Q. And so why do you have to report any of the
- 4 animals to DNR?
- 5 A. Because they are on my permit.
- 6 Q. Or I guess maybe a better way to ask that is:
- 7 What does the DNR regulate for you?
- 8 A. It regulates what I own, how I own.
- 9 Q. Okay.
- 10 A. They come out and do inspections.
- 11 Q. Okay. And then how about what does the USDA
- 12 regulate for you?
- 13 A. Same thing.

- 2 Exhibit 1, as you look at the list do you see any
- 3 of them that you can remember when you obtained

- 5 A. Like I said, my first wolf was in '92.

- 7 A. I think my first raccoon was in '01. And so it
- 8 would have probably been '02 with some of the
- 9 fox. And the other ones I couldn't tell you.

- 11 A. But they were all before 2005 except for the

- 21 A. That fluctuates. It depends on if I sell
 - something or something gets killed or something
- 23 dies or if something is bread or if we pelt
- 24 something.
- 25 Q. Okay. Is it a situation where you wait until

- 5 Q. Okay.
- 6 A. Then we change inventory.
- 7 Q. And then similarly, say that you've pelted
- 8 several animals, would you then also do another
- 9 inventory?
- 10 A. Yes.
- 11 Q. Okay. Who actually then does the inventory or
- 12 count?
- 13 A. There is one of the three of us.
- 14 Q. Okay. And when you say the three of you --
- 15 A. Either Danny, Adam or I.
- 16 Q. Okay.
- 17 A. And that depends on for which license.
- 18 Q. And when you say "which license", are you
- 19 talking about the DNR, USDA and Department of Ag?
- 20 A. Yes.
- 21 Q. Okay. Do those agencies require you to report
- 22 the number right after one of those events?
- 23 A. No.
- 24 Q. Okay. And how do you physically keep the
- 25 records? Like is it on a computer or in a

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- 2 A. You have inventory sheets.

notebook?

3 Q. Okay.

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- 4 A. So you just write them down with a pen and piece
- 5 of paper. And the USDA has certain sheets. The
- 6 DNR you've got to fill out their certain sheet
- 7 once a year. So does the Minnesota Department of
- 8 Ag. So there is -- that's one of the things on
- 9 your questions, your discovery questions, how you
- 10 take it? You take it with a pencil and a piece
- 11 of paper and you just count.
- 12 Q. Okay. And then do you retain the inventory
- 13 sheets that you've prepared, or do you have like
- 14 a retention schedule of how long you keep them?
- 15 A. We keep them until the inventory changes again.
- 16 I don't get what you are saying.
- 17 Q. And what I mean to say, say for example you did
- an inventory two months ago, and then say today
- 19 you do inventory again, would you still keep that
- sheet from two months ago?
- 21 A. No.
- **Q.** So you only keep the current inventory sheet?
- 23 A. Right.
- 24 Q. Okay. Now, do you recall the last time that you
- 25 did an inventory?
 - KINSELLA, HARTIGAN & KELZER, INC.

- 1 A. Monday.
- 2 Q. Okay. And if you just pelted a couple of wolves
- 3 last night, and might do some more today, would
- 4 you do inventory again this week or --
- 5 A. It depends on if my guy comes up from Indiana,
- 6 because then he'll take all the wolves. So then
- 7 I'll just wait until he comes up so I don't have
 - to redo them every time.
- 9 Q. Sure. And then do you keep your inventory
- 10 record then on your property?
- 11 A. Yes.

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- **12 Q.** Do you have like a physical office that you use
- 13 for your businesses?
- 14 A. Kind of.
- 15 Q. Okay. And I suppose in some way your office is
- 16 outside, but where would you actually keep any of
- 17 your paper records?
- 18 A. It's inside the barn on the second floor.
- 19 Q. Okay. And since you just did inventory on
- 20 Monday, so you remembered that right now you have
- about 49 wolves. Do you remember off the top of
- 22 your head how many of the other --
- 23 A. I didn't do the inventory. Adam did.
- **24 Q.** Oh, okay. And did you look at the inventory
- 25 after he did it?

KINSELLA, HARTIGAN & KELZER, INC.

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- 1 A. No.
- Q. Okay.
- 3 A. He's a biologist. I figure he can do that
- 4 himself.
- 5 Q. Okay. Overall, do you -- I know that you said
- 6 that the numbers fluctuate depending on breeding
- 7 and pelting. Do you have an opinion or
- 8 understanding of whether your overall populations
- 9 of the animals grows each year?
- 10 A. It has, yes.
- 11 Q. Okay.
- 12 A. Except for the last year it didn't grow very
- 13 much, except for the wolves.
- **14 Q.** Okay.
- 15 A. Again, when you don't have a barn to breed in,
- 16 you would -- you don't -- your population doesn't
- 17 increase very much.
- 18 Q. And let's talk about that a little bit. Now the
- 19 new barn was built because the old barn was
- 20 burned in a fire; correct?
- 21 A. Correct.
- 22 Q. And that was -- when was that?
- 23 A. November 15th of 2010.
- 24 Q. Okay. And the old barn, what did you use that
- 25 for?

- 1 A. Artificial insemination. I had a couple horse
- 2 stalls in there. I had my office in there. I
- 3 had a freeze dryer. I had three walk-in
- 4 freezers. So it was pelt handling. And I don't
- 5 know if I said skinning or not.
- 6 Q. Okay. And so after that fire -- well, first,
- 7 did you have any of the animals living in that
- 8 barn, the old barn?
- 9 A. I had prairie dogs.
- 10 Q. Okay. After that barn fire, what did you use
- 11 for skinning, what structure?
- 12 A. We didn't.
- 13 Q. Okay. So, for the winter of 2010 and early
- 14 2011, you did not do any skinning?
- 15 A. No.
- 16 Q. Okav.
- 17 A. Because I'm not skinning in my house. And last
- 18 year the township wouldn't let me in my barn.
- 19 Q. Okay. And how about after the barn fire, did
- 20 you do the artificial insemination anywhere else
- 21 that winter?
- 22 A. No. I don't know about you, but I probably
- 23 wouldn't want fox semen in your house, just like
- 24 I don't want it in mine.
- 25 Q. Fair enough. And how about -- the same thing

KINSELLA, HARTIGAN & KELZER, INC.

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- 1 with pelt handling. Did you do that anywhere
- 2 else that season of 2010 early 2011?
- 3 A. 2010 I didn't. 2011 I sold whole carcasses to
- taxidermy people, as much as I could. Which then 4
- 5 you also lose money because then they have to
- 6 pelt them, because you don't skin them. So you
- 7 lose money because they have to do all the work.
- 8 Q. Okay. And then with regards to the prairie
- 9 dogs, did you move them somewhere then after the
- 10 barn fire?
- 11 A. I moved them into the house.
- 12 Q. Okay.
- 13 A. And it was early winter. So the animals that
- 14 usually go in the barn, weren't in there yet. So
- 15 then that winter everything came into the house,
- 16 or the other barn on Dodd. Which then also made
- 17 me not be able to board as many horses as I used
- 18 to.
- 19 Q. Okay.
- 20 A. Because I had things like porcupines and geese
- and possums and woodchucks in my horse stalls. 21
- 22 Q. Okay. So if the fire was November 2010, when
- 23 you mentioned the other animals going inside
- 24 later, like what time of the winter would that 25
 - be?

- A. They usually go in right around December 1st.
- 2 Q. Okay.
- A. It's usually not cold until December, January,
- 4 February.
- 5 Q. So like December of 2010 is when they would have
